Continent (Any of the world's seven large areas of land - normally containing several countries)

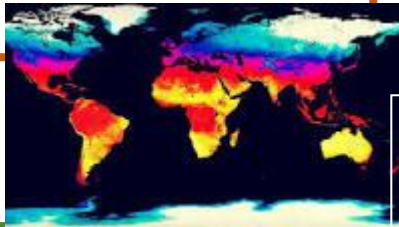
Country (A nation with its own government, which occupies some land)

Holy (special because of connection with God)

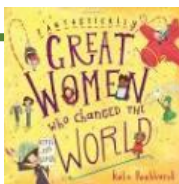
Cathedral (large, important church)

Earth and Space

Spherical (shaped like a sphere - shape of earth)

Earth, sun (star round which the earth orbits), moon (natural satellite of the earth)

Solar system (eight planets and their moons in orbit around the sun)

Geocentric (measured from the centre of the earth)

Heliocentric (measured from the centre of the sun)

Orbit (curved path round a star, planet or moon)

Rotate (move in a circle round an axis or centre)

Axis (imaginary line round which something rotates)

Forces

Gravity (force that attracts something towards the centre of the earth)

Push/pull, force (strength or energy)

Isaac Newton (discovered laws of gravity)

Mass (quantity or amount of something)

Air resistance (forces against motion of object travelling through air)

Friction (resistance of one surface to another)

Feminism (Full equality for women at home, at work and throughout society)

Equal Rights (To be treated equally under the law)

Rock n Roll - (Popular music with a heavy beat and simple melodies)
